60 YEARS OF CAMPING MINISTRY --- FROM 1948-2008 --- IT'S A DIFFERENT WORLD

As BLC prepares to celebrate its 60th year of Camping Ministry. I'm amazed at the changes our world has seen since that 1st camper set foot on the BLC grounds 60 years ago. Consider a few of these changes: *Our Camp in 1948: Army Barracks, Out Houses, hardly any state codes or regulations, No Full-time Staff, Reg. Fee-\$10.00*

60 years ago Bear Lake Camp

was founded as a ministry that used the unique qualities of Christian Camping to point our youth to a deeper understanding and walk with Jesus Christ. Helping our youth hear and understand Christ's calling of Salvation and Service is a huge responsibility that our previous generation heard and responded to by founding Bear Lake Camp. Thousands of kids have attended and have encouraged and been changed through their summer experience at "The Bear". What a noble and worthwhile endeavor those camp

workers of the past have given. Today the challenge and mission from Christ is still before us as his followers. The need, I believe, is even greater as our world has so drastically changed in technology, population, morality, culture and our pace of life.
